<p><b>Main Outcomes</b></p> <p>All three strands of the intergenerational project are progressing; meeting to discuss the creation of a community garden based in the children's centre scheduled for 8<sup>th</sup> May, school heads currently discussing the integration of 'life stories' project into curriculum, meeting to discuss proposals for developing existing befriending scheme being convened by LLW.</p> <p>Forum participants given presentations from health professionals about work related to reducing social isolation and from the Seaford Chapter 'Cycling without Age' project.</p> <p>Participants also agreed future topics for Forums in 2018-19 to include; Mental Health and Transport</p> <p><b>Gaps</b></p> <p>There are local initiatives in place aimed at reducing social isolation, but there is a lack of overall coordination and befriending schemes rely on a lot of voluntary input</p> <p><b>Barriers</b></p> <p>There are different ideas of where the emphasis of building on existing, or creating new befriending initiatives should focus.</p>
