<p>Participants suggested several potential ideas for intergenerational work and prioritised three main strands to take forward;</p> <p>creating a community garden in the children's centre  a 'life stories' project (in collaboration with local schools)  some form of befriending scheme initiative (a new model, or building on existing one)</p> <p>Future themes for 2018-19 were specifically discussed.
